## MFD Awarded AFG

The department was notified on July 8, that we have been awarded a grant package of \$249,620 for SCBA. These funds will go towards the purchase of harnesses, face pieces and spare cylinders. Captain John Lapi and Engineer Brian Jackson worked very hard to assemble the information required for the grant application and deserve recognition for this success.

The original request was for \$588,000; however, the amount awarded will make a significant impact in addressing our respiratory protection needs. The grant is through the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) program, which is administered by FEMA. Of the amount, \$22,692 is the department's 10% match. – *Chief Lantzer*

### Mentoring Advances the Quality of Future Fire Service Leaders

Seasoned fire officials can help prepare next generation's leaders for excellence

With varying missions, a constantly changing environment and decreasing revenue sources that hamper an increasing service demand, anyone in the fire service today knows our occupation is in constant fluctuation. The core of our occupation—firefighting—occurs less frequently, but when we do respond to fires they're more intense and more toxic than they used to be, and they spread faster due to the hydrocarbon-based products that fuel them. Add lightweight construction and you have a recipe for disaster.

## EMS coverage for mass gatherings and public events

### What is mass gathering and why is it different?

Perhaps not surprisingly, there is not one single definition as to what constitutes a mass gathering. The National Association of EMS Physicians (NAEMSP) states that a mass gathering is an “organized emergency health services provided for spectators and participants at events in which at least 1,000 persons are gathered at a specific location for a defined period of time.” The World Health Organization defines a mass gathering as “an organized or unplanned event where the number of people attending is sufficient to strain the planning and response resources of the community, state or nation hosting the event.” These two definitions could be combined to define a mass gathering as a large group of people who gather for a specific purpose, at a specific location, where the potential for emergency response is significant and would overwhelm the daily operating resources of the local EMS system.

More practically speaking, examples of mass gatherings include events such as:

- Festivals, parades and fairs
- Sporting events at the college and professional level
- Major political and social events
- Air shows, auto races, music concerts, and religious gatherings
- Running, biking and triathlon races


**SAFETY/HEALTH – Captain Eric Ackerman**

The names of the deceased and the injured are being withheld pending next of kin notification. One injured BLM employee was flow to Renown Regional Medical Center in Reno.

"We will provide more information at the appropriate time, said Nevada BLM State Communication Chief Steve Clutter, "Our hearts are heavy, but our focus, our thoughts, and our prayers are with the families of these extraordinary brave people who served to protect the people of Nevada and the public lands of that belong to all of us."

# Jake Tarin is hanging tough, but could use our prayers...



On July 9, my crew and I were honored to spend the morning with Jake Tarin. Jake has been battling Leukemia since 2014. I have known Jake since he was 6 years old. His older sister and my daughter played on the same travel softball team and Jake's Dad was the team manager and coach. Jake was the little brother always running around the softball fields getting into mischief with the other younger siblings.



Jake was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia on September 23, 2014, which is a cancer of the blood and bone marrow. Jake began chemotherapy in 2015, and had a reaction from the chemo causing pancreatitis. After having multiple surgeries Jake's health stabilized and he went into remission. On March 23, 2016, Jake's leukemia relapsed and he required more chemotherapy. After his last round of chemo, Jake's Dad contacted me and asked if he could bring Jake by the station so Jake could see the fire truck.


