SAFETY / HEALTH Captain Eric Ackerman

The twelfth life safety initiative focuses on violent incident responses. The initiative asks fire departments to proactively develop *and* champion policies for violent responses. According to NFPA, one firefighter dies each year due to some form of violence. These facts obviously exclude the first responder deaths related to the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. Policies should cover a range, from common assault calls to active shooter and terrorism incidents.

Our addition of an active shooter response policy demonstrates that the Murrieta Fire Department is heading in the right direction in this regard. This program gives our members the best opportunity to help the most people, while maintaining our responder safety. As we continue to implement similar policies for different incidents, it is important that each of us follow up with regular training to ensure their success.

The initiative also recommends some additional strategies:

- Apply dynamic risk management
- Improve communication with local law enforcement
- Define and expand the role of dispatchers in reducing risk
- Prohibit single person resource response
- Communicate and train with law enforcement prior to incidents
- Leave if violence occurs during fire department operations
- Obtain stakeholder understanding and buy-in of response and deployment policies including non-response and non-engagement procedures

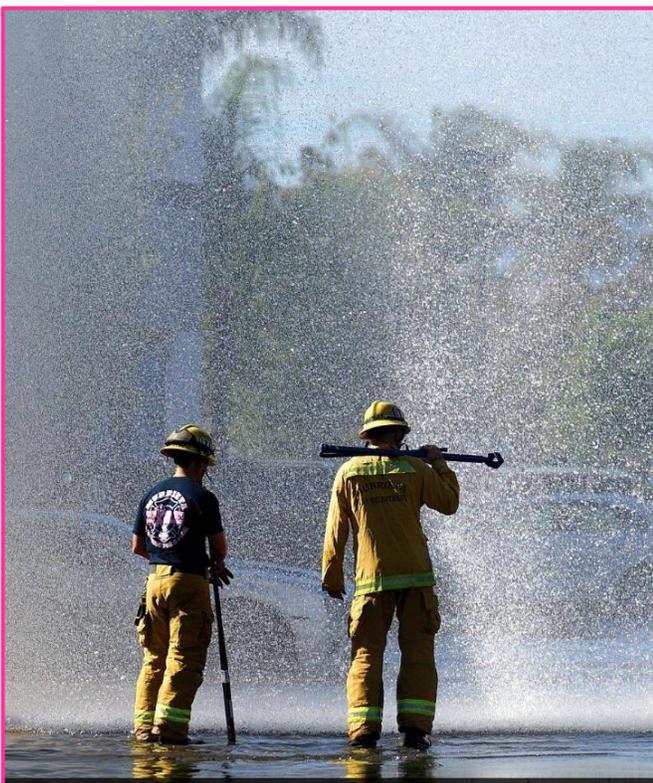
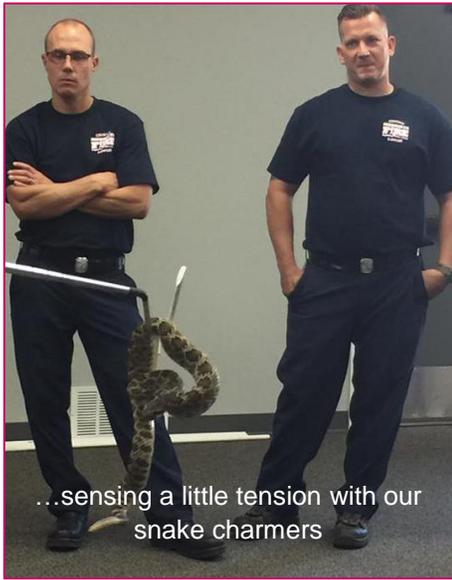
