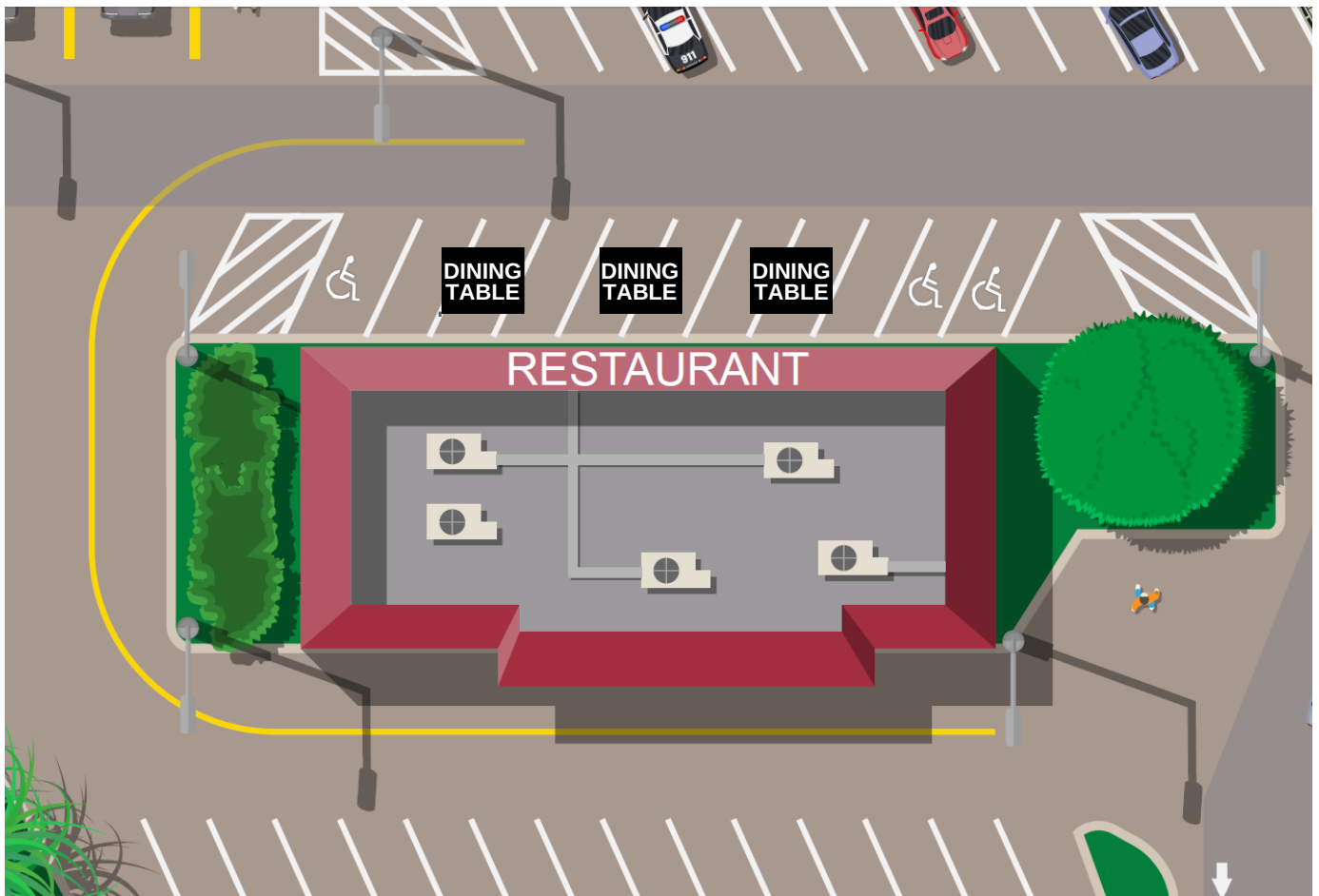


# MURRIETA DINES OUT



The City of Murrieta recognizes the challenges that occupancy limits may have upon our dine-in restaurants. In order to help ease the challenges that this restriction may have, we are enacting a temporary Outdoor Dining Program. This will be meant to allow our restaurants the opportunity to reduce seating capacity, but replace some of that loss with outdoor seating in an area that is not permanently enclosed. This program will only be in effect as long as indoor occupancy restrictions are in effect.

## **Requirements:**

- Restaurants can open at 25% occupancy
- Temporary outdoor dining not to exceed number of displaced tables/chairs
- Utilize private parking spaces adjacent to restaurant
- Outdoor dining cannot block fire lanes or ADA access
- Egress routes must be maintained
- ADA spaces must be maintained
- Obtain property manager approval

## **SCE's Safety Guidelines:**

- SCE requires that there be a minimum of 5 feet of space around all overhead facilities, such as poles, and 15 feet of space around all underground facilities, such as vault lids, manholes, vent pipes, padmounted transformers, etc.
- Seating or structures below overhead conductors and/or under the 'drip line' should be prohibited.
- Public eating/dining at tables should not be situated on top of energized vault lids, energized underground structures, or next to vent pipes, etc.
- We would appreciate the City's commitment to cooperating with us should we need to access any equipment nearby any supplemental restaurant seating, including help with the relocation of water-filled k-rails or other barriers. Your cooperation will help address concerns about our customers experiencing much higher customer minutes of interruption (CMI) due to the inability to access & open critical structures for switching, energizing, de-energizing, etc.
