

# Haircuts and Nails Shops Move Outdoors

**The City of Murrieta** is helping local personal care services (hair salons, barbershops and nail salons) transition to modified outdoor operations, as allowed by the State of California's Public Health order.

Recent temporary changes in City parking regulations will allow for services to take place in a businesses' private parking spaces.

You will find more specifics on the back. We want to make this easy, and are not imposing City fees or permits for temporary outdoor salon or barbershop operations.

# City of Murrieta Outdoor Hair and Nail Guidelines

Please read and follow all [State of California Updated Guidance for Outdoor Personal Care Services](#) and the [Dept. of Consumer Affairs Guide for Barbering and Cosmetology](#). Both publications include important requirements and recommendations for outdoor operations not noted here.



- Make sure to get approval from property manager.
- Salons and barbershops may use private parking spaces, adjacent to the building, but must maintain ADA spaces.
- The business may operate under a tent, canopy, or other sun shelter as long as no more than one side is closed, allowing sufficient outdoor air movement.
- Implement measures to physically separate workers by at least six feet using measures such as physical partitions or markings.
- Do not block fire lanes, ADA access or exit routes.
- Make sure all cords are secure, and do not present fire or tripping hazards.
- Do not allow customers to enter the building for any reason.
- Chemical hair services, shampooing, piercing and electrolysis **are not allowed** outdoors per State of California [guidelines](#) due to water/drainage and health/safety considerations.
- The State also requires that face coverings must be worn when interacting in-person with members of the public (indoors or outdoors).
