Active-Duty Military Banner Program

The City of Murrieta has arranged for the community to honor and pay tribute to the courage, commitment, and heroism of themen and women who are currently serving in the United States Armed Forces through its Active-Duty Military Banner Program.

Application Requirements

To be eligible for the banner program, an honoree must be:

- A current resident of the City of Murrieta
- An active-duty member of the United States Armed Forces

Banner Installation

Installation will take place twice each year; by Memorial Day and by Veterans Day. Each banner will remain up for a period of one year, then retired and given to the honoree or family member at a City Council meeting. Banners are to be installed along California Oaks and Murrieta Hot Springs Roads.

Banner Design

The front and back of each banner, which measures approximately 2' x 5', will list the honoree's name and branch of service and include a photo (if desired) or the branch logo as well as the sponsor logo should there be one.

Cost

There is no cost for the banner or its installation; however, the program is operated through tax-deductible donations.

The City of Murrieta will accept donations in any amount to help fund the costs associated with this program.





Los Alamos Hills Sports Park has been a bustling hive of activity ever since its official grand opening on July 29, 2006. What with six soccer fields, three football fields, four ball fields, three tot lots, and “Get Fit” and equestrian trails, there is always something going on. Traditional sports like soccer, football, and baseball primarily are played at this location with Murrieta Youth Soccer, Pop Warner Football, Friday Night Lights, and Murrieta Pony and Murrieta Little League making their home here, hosting regular season and tournament play, but every so often you’ll find a lacrosse tournament

being played or even neighbors coming together to toss a Frisbee back and forth.

This park is also home to the City’s largest picnic shelter. It can be reserved for company picnics, church picnics, and large family or other gatherings. It is located near two of the largest tot lots in the City as well that encourage and promote healthy play and growth for children 2 to 12 years old. The surrounding open turf areas allow for all sorts of time-honored picnic games, kite-flying, and bubble-blowing.

Equestrian riders enjoy this site for its connectivity to outer-lying areas and run/walkers enjoy the D.G. trail system that interconnects the various elements of the site creating a variety of options for distance and fitness levels.

The operating hours for any of Murrieta’s park sites without sports field lighting are from sunrise to sunset. To utilize the lit athletic fields beyond sunset, a reservation is required as is the case for any organized league, camp, clinic, or large picnicking group. 
Janet Carbajal

The north side of the building consists of staff offices, a kitchen (equipped with snow-cone and popcorn machines), bathrooms, and a conference room with a modular table able to accommodate one-on-one schoolwork help and Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) meetings.

The outdoor space of the Youth Center plays host to pickup basketball games, football games, special events, coffee shop-style tables and chairs, and a Playworld Systems NEOS (an outdoor multiplayer electronic game that promotes active play).

Murrieta Youth Center memberships are available for 6th-9th grade students only. Annual Memberships are \$20 for Murrieta residents and MVUSD students. Annual Memberships are \$25 for non-residents and non-MVUSD students

Hours of Operation: Monday 2 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.
Tue-Fri 3 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.

During School breaks: Mon-Fri 11:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m

The south side of the building is comprised of three rooms: A one thousand square foot lounge equipped with a 65" flat screen TV, PS4, a ping pong table, a table-top shuffle board game, an air hockey table, internet streaming music, lounge chairs, couches and belly-high tables. This room's focus is for the youth to make it their own, so much so that they are even able to write on the walls! The lounge is designed to be a youth's place to relax, unwind, and enjoy as their space.






